
Discussion was held on the special levies for the year 2019. After more discussion, it was decided to lower the Street Levy from \$70,000.00 to \$50,000.00 and the Water and Sewer Levy lowered from \$80,000.00 to \$60,000.00. A motion was made by Watson and seconded by Bezdicek. This motion also was to increase the tax levy for property taxes and new construction by the allowed 1%. All were in favor to adopt Resolution No. 404X.

The Clerk reported that the Critical Areas Ordinance update is ready to submit for approval by the Department of Commerce. After their approval, the Town will then pass the Ordinance.



A piece of property owned by Larry Harrison is being sold and a new line needs to be installed. An application needs to be filled out before anything can happen.
