

## MEETING OF OCTOBER 28, 2019

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Webb. Council Members, Bezdicek, Hinds, Smick, Smith, and Watson were in attendance. Also attending were Amy Watt and Maya Aune.

The minutes of the October 14, 2019 Meeting were read and approved as read.

The payables were presented to the Council for review and discussion. The payables were moved by Watson and seconded by Smith. Motion carried by vote of the Council.

The Clerk reminded everyone that the next meeting falls on Veteran's Day. So, the Council will meet on Tuesday, November 12, 2019.

It was reported that Candy Behrens has asked if a street light could be installed on East Street. Another street to look at is Willson Road.

Amy Watt and Maya Aune reported on the pedestrian safety project that the Ag class have been working on. Due to generous donations, they are close to installing them at some intersections around town.

The Public Hearing was held for the 2020 Budget. After discussion, a motion was made by Watson and seconded by Hinds to accept the Final Budget and approve Ordinance No. 418X.

The Clerk reported that the School Superintendent called and discussed the issue of rerouting their ground water so it will no longer go into our sewer system. They are continuing to work on this issue and expressed that they would like to sit down with the Council and discuss everything.


The Clerk presented the Bias Maintenance Software Agreement for 2020. It was moved by Smick and seconded by Bezdicek.

Steve Gibson presented a building permit application to build a steel garage. Our building inspector reviewed the plans and gave his ok. After reviewing the site map and application, a motion was made by Smith and seconded by Hinds to ok the permit.

Chris Canaday reported on the Violation Letter that was received from the Dept. of Ecology. Because he doesn't have a level 2 classification, the town is in violation. He is working on getting his license and attending classes to help pass the test. In the interim, the town will hire a class two operator to sign off on the DMR's and reports. He has found a class to attend. It was moved by Watson and seconded by Smick.

The St. John Pharmacy has asked if a 15-minute parking sign could be installed in front of her business. The maintenance guys were instructed to order one and we will see how it works.
